REPORT CARDS

There will be two nine-week periods in each semester. Nine-week tests will be given to the students. This test will count as twenty percent of their total nine-week grades. Sufficient daily work shall be assigned so as to count at least one-third of a student's nine-week daily average. Semester tests will country for twenty percent of the student's final semester grade. Four and one-half week reports will be issued to students before parent-teacher conferences that are scheduled at the end of the first four and one-half weeks of each semester. The following grading system is in effect:

A = 90-100 B = 80-89 C = 70-79 D = 60-60 F = 59 and below

The grade of "I" may be issued when a student's work is incomplete. This work must be made up before the end of three weeks unless the teacher or principal gave special permission. Parents are urged to examine all report cards and four and one-half week reports with care each time they are received. Parents should contact the teacher at once so that misunderstandings can be avoided, and benefits derived to help the child.

Parents desiring a conference with a teacher must call for an appointment and arrange for a time when classes are not in session.

High school students who are on the eligibility list as ineligible may not participate in any extracurricular activities. This includes and all school activities occurring at Gracemont Public Schools. These activities will include, but not be limited to, ballgames, class parties, club meetings, and assembly programs. The students will also be expected to be with their teacher from 8:00 a.m. to 8:20 a.m. for homeroom period. This policy is intended to ensure that each student has the opportunity to achieve his or her maximum academic potential.

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
