

DETENTION

A student in this district may be detained after school hours for disciplinary reasons if, in the judgment of a school administrator or the student's teacher, such disciplinary measures are warranted. If a student is to be detained, the parent must be notified of the planned detention and, in the case of bus students, arrangements made for the student's transportation home after detention. In those cases where transportation is required, twenty-four hours notice will be given so that transportation may be arranged.

Parents shall be asked to arrange for the transportation of the detained student. However, if the parent cannot or will not provide transportation, an alternative disciplinary procedure must be substituted. Students who are detained after school must not be left alone during their detention. Supervision of students in detention must be provided or arranged for by the teacher or administrator who detains them. Detention is limited to sixty minutes on any one school day.

In-School Detention

An alternative method of discipline is In-School Detention (ISD). Students in ISD will be in the designated classroom upon arrival at campus and will be dismissed by the person in charge.

1. Parents will be notified of a student's placement in ISD.
2. The student will be completely isolated from the regular school population during his or her stay in ISD.
3. The student's assignments will be brought to the classroom.
4. The student will have the opportunity to eat breakfast and lunch at a time when no other students are in the cafeteria.
5. The school will provide a break for using the bathroom and getting a drink during the morning and afternoon. These will be when other students are not on break.
6. The minimum stay in ISD shall be three days.
7. If a student is uncooperative or disruptive in ISD, their ISD will be extended or they will be suspended from school.

This program is designed to provide an alternative setting for students who have problems conforming to rules and regulations in the traditional classroom setting and is an opportunity for them to continue their education for a time prior to re-entry into the traditional classroom setting.
